

#### **GWICH'IN SEASONS CALENDAR**

The economy of the Gwich'in Settlement Area includes the "traditional economy" based on the harvesting of plants and animals and the "wage economy" based on part and full time employment. The traditional economy is associated primarily with the annual harvesting of renewable resources. The calendar shows the seasonal land uses for the Gwich'in as one example of the annual harvesting of wildlife associated with the traditional economy. Trapping, hunting, fishing and vegetation harvesting are traditional activities guaranteed to the Gwich'in through the Gwich'in Land Claim. The Gwich'in also have the right to travel and maintain hunting, trapping and fishing camps.
